


Chance Wins Hearts at HCHS....and a New Home and Name!



Chance came to HCHS when President Christina Dickinson received a call from a woman saying that workers found a white dog in their barn. When Dickinson got to the barn, she found a terribly emaciated, injured Boxer. He was scared and wary, but with a few hot dogs, he got into her vehicle.

Chance's journey to finding a forever home was long and arduous. He first had to overcome his emaciation and timidity. After a week, Chance began to allow volunteers to begin loving on him. It didn't take long for everyone to decide that Chance would be a forever memorable boy! He got some special food, went on gradually longer walks, and was finally cleared to have his leg operated on and to be neutered. This was a big day for Chance....it meant that

once he was healed, the officers could start looking for that special home to call his own.

Many people inquired about Chance, and it was a difficult task to weed through the wonderful potential adopters to find the perfect one for Chance. But....on July 5, four months after he came into the shelter, Chance got to go home.



HCHS Begins TNR Season in Logan, Magnolia, and Woodbine

Spaying and Neutering animals is one of the missions of the Harrison County Humane Society of Iowa. Every animal that is adopted from the shelter has been spayed or neutered. Officers and volunteers implore community members to spay and neuter their pets to help control the pet population. But what about the feral cats that roam our communities?

HCHS steps in to do Trap, Neuter, Release programs

in Harrison County communities that have signed onto our 28E Agreement and who agree to have an event. In May of 2016, officers and volunteers conducted the first TNR of the season in both Logan and Magnolia. A total of five cats were trapped, fixed, vaccinated, a sample was tested for Feline Leukemia, and healthy cats were released back into the community to continue to do their job of helping to control the rodent population.

In July of 2016, a TNR was held in Woodbine. 18 cats were trapped, fixed and vaccinated, a sample was tested for Feline Leukemia, and healthy cats were released back into the community.

Prior to any TNR event, the community is notified through the newspaper and through City Hall and on Facebook. Residents are asked to keep their pet cats indoors during the time of the TNR. Volunteers will also immediately release any cats with collars. Prior to treatment, all cats are scanned for microchips.

HCHS Purchases Vehicle



For years, the shelter has operated without a dedicated vehicle. All transportation of animals has been done using the personal vehicles of officers and volunteers. Personal vehicles have been used to: pick up stray dogs and cats; transport shelter animals to veterinary appointments in Harrison County and to Blair and Omaha; transport TNR cats and traps to the Kitty Clinic; and more. Volunteers have graciously shared their vehicles and gas to get the job done. The result -- usually a stinky, fur-coated vehicle!

Beginning in 2015, officers toyed with the idea of purchasing a vehicle dedicated to shelter use. Finally, the finances were right, the right vehicle came along, and HCHS is now the proud owner of the van you see pictured!




Litter in the Ruff Golf Tournament Breaks Records:



